INNER TURF FOR THREE-YEAR-OLDS AND UPWARD. No nomination fee. A supplemental nomination fee of \$1,000 may be made at time of entry. \$500 to pass the entry box and an additional \$500 to start. All starters including supplements will be required to pay both entry and starting fees. The purse to be divided 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among the remaining finishers. Three year olds, 121 lbs. Older, 124 lbs. Turf weights: Non-winners of a graded sweepstake on the turf in 2010 allowed 3 lbs.; a sweepstake on the turf in 2010 or a graded sweepstake on the turf in 2009, 5 lbs.; four races on the turf, 7 lbs. Dirt weights: Non-winners of a sweepstake on the dirt in 2010 allowed 2 lbs.; a sweepstake on the dirt; or \$45,000 on the dirt in 2010 4 lbs.; three races on the dirt, 6 lbs. (Maiden, claiming and starter races not considered). A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. The New York Racing Association reserves the right to transfer this race to the Main Track. In the event that this race is taken off the turf, dirt weights will apply and it may be subject to downgrading upon review by the Graded Stakes Committee. Closed Saturday, October 2, 2010 with 33 Nominations and 1 Supplement.

VIOLON SACRE sat reserved along the outside for nearly three-quarters, maneuvered into the three path coming to the three-eighths pole, inched up towards the front during the ensuing furlong, was set down, spinning three wide into the stretch, took off in earnest after being straightened away, closed readily during the run through the furlong grounds, found a stubborn foe in WHATSTHESCRIP, finally forged to the front in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole and edged clear while being kept busy to the end. WHATSTHESCRIP (IRE) established command after WAR HOOT was taken back during the straightaway approach to the opening the bend, set the fractions slightly off the hedge, and with the rider applying a nice hold, continued along on the same scenario during most of the proceedings around the second turn, was put to encouragement heading for the stretch, with several rivals in close proximity and by now in hot pursuit, reached the furlong marker, clinging to narrowest of edges, offered good resistance for another sixteenth, reluctantly yielding at this point, but finished with good courage to garner place honors. BALETTI reserved along the outside, was called upon while angling three wide into the stretch and came home with good energy to grab the show. WAR HOOT away well, was taken back, conceding the early advantage to the runner up, contently tracked that opponent from the inside under a good hold, continued to bide his time until nearing the quarter pole, cut the corner under encouragement, had a clear alleyway along the inside awaiting him, but failed to deliver up the needed kick. WESLEY brought up the back of the pack while taking the inside route, tried to squeeze through tight quarters to improve position coming to the half mile pole but was denied when BALETTI held his ground, steadied slightly, losing some ground and momentum as a result, eventually came four wide into the lane, but lacked the necessary stretch response. OPERATION RED DAWN forwardly placed along the outside, weakened after turning for home. INTERPATATION rated prompting the leader, gave way.
