SARATOGA SNACKS sat forwardly placed nearly from the get-go, increased his presence after going a half and disputed the pace as the widest of three, gained the lead and got set down, dug in with good determination in the final furlong to stave off the runner up. BIGGER IS BETTOR settled near the back of the pack in the initial staged, entered the turn two wide and stayed put there until approaching the top of the lane, was gradually taken outward traversing through the furlong grounds, began the last eighth from the four path, came home with good energy to garner the place. MONEYINYOUR POCKET brushed with AWESOME VISION as the pair left the starting gate, assumed a forward position, contested the pace from between rivals proceeding around the turn, had the fight spill over into the lane, only now going at it one on one with the eventual winner, kept that pursuit until midstretch before weakening. SPA CITY FEVER kept watch on the front runners while contently taking the inside route, was forced to remain under a firm hold by the pilot starting from the five-sixteenths marker, found enough clearance and slipped into the two path coming to the head of the stretch, didn't need to split rivals soon afterwards once the former pacesetter began to back away, scurried into a solid contending position during the rest of the way to the eighth pole, failed to sustain the move. ZETTERHOLM three wide entering the turn, was in the four path exiting it, lacked the necessary stretch response. AWESOME VISION away a length behind the next to last breaker after making slight contact with MONEYINYOUR POCKET at the start, raced from off the rail throughout, was in the two path at the top of the turn when put to a prolonged drive, got fanned seven wide into upper stretch, made no impact. READTHEPROSPECTUS departed the backstretch from the four path, had already felt the whip in the vicinity of the three-eighths pole, made no headway then tired steadily after entering the stretch. WARRIOROFHEROSES broke on top and kept control, was gradually guided over to the rail making his way along the chute, carved the pace, being rated while leading a tightly-packed group by a slight advantage, had the pressure pick up a notch upon reaching the turn, forced now to argue to hold on while being pressed by a pair parked to his outside, yielded a few strides past the five-sixteenths pole, had little left a furlong down the road and faded.
