LADY COHIBA got off slowly, brushing the right side of the starting gate after ducking inward at the break, moved up willingly under light encouragement to rejoin the pack soon afterwards, rode the rail, rated along and uninvolved with the ongoing pace dispute, slipped outward in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, ranged up, splitting foes and bumping lightly with HEARTS OF RED, turned for home to poke a head in front, raced as a team with SEA ISLAND during the ensuing furlong, edged away thereafter under good handling to prove best. SEA ISLAND bobbed after bumping with STREET SAVY at the break, moved up willingly to take up a forward post, sparred with the aforementioned rival, taking up residence in the two path shortly before reaching the half mile pole, battled heads apart before momentarily shaking free, gained little respite soon coming under attack by the eventual winner, fought well with that foe until the eighth pole, got turned away, continued onward with good courage to be second best. HEARTS OF RED hand urged to be the early leader, had the rider turn his head back, saw considerable company working their way towards the front and was taken in hand and allowed to ease back, sat perched three wide, readily keeping pace with an embattled twosome, brushed near hind quarters with the top one entering the stretch, failed to fire appreciably. OPALITE within range from the two path, tired after gong six furlongs. POOH CORNER three wide on the turn, was let out a notch before reaching the end of the backstretch, folded. STREET SAVY made contact with the runner up out of the gate, went on to argue for command with that opponent in short order, tucked along the rail coming to the nine-sixteenths pole, fell back steadily despite asked for run leaving midpoint on the turn.
