Footnotes

GOLD TRADER saved ground, found room and slipped off the rail late on the turn, was put to encouragement approaching the head of the stretch, altered course for better racing room at the three-sixteenths pole, closed in with good energy to poke a head down in front with an eighth to go, edged away from the field under steady hand urging. LAST HURRAH patiently tracked the front runners while taking the inside route, was given his cue and launched a successful rail bid for command as the field turned for home, came under pressure from the top one soon afterwards, left the furlong grounds only a sliver

behind that rival, fell back steadily thereafter then had just enough left at the end to salvage the place. IDLE AMERICAN remained unhurried from off the inside for nearly three-quarters, was already under some rousing spinning from the three path into the lane, was maneuvered outward at least three paths in upper stretch to gain optimal clearance, displayed a good kick down the center of the course en route for the show. SHOUTOUT forwardly placed while racing three wide on the second turn, flattened out. HURRICANE ELVIS lagged behind in the initial stages, was let out a notch attempting to pick up the pace, was under much stronger hand urging entering the stretch, found his best stride leaving the eighth pole. THE LAURELS loped along down on the rail proceeding down the backstretch, began to close the gap slightly upon reaching the far turn, was taken off the inside in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, spun two wide for the stretch run and got called upon, failed to muster up the needed response. DELEGATED rated on the lead near the two path until the quarter pole, gave way. UNPRECEDENTED got off awkwardly after throwing his head just before the field was sent off and running, settled along the inside soon afterwards, got set down by the five-sixteenths pole, failed to rally appreciably. WHEREISJOHNSHOUSE four wide departing the chute, rushed up to take up a forward position when rank, pressed the issue a bit closer to the rail for most of the way around the bend, tired steadily after turning for home. RUGGED RASCAL tried to sweep into contention with a four wide run leaving the backstretch, wasn't up to the task at hand. EASTSIDE TRAIN lunged at the break, underwent a three wide journey and folded. TOUCH OF SILVER raced along the outside, was taken in hand while tiring after completing six furlongs.
