Footnotes

DR. TOM G rated prompting the leader from the outside continued to bide time on the turn, moved when ready approaching the quarter pole, fought his way to the front leaving the eighth pole and edged clear. ELDRIDGE stalked the leader three wide on the turn, was asked for a response spinning into the lane, and rallied with good courage to grab second. MODEST fought the bit early showing some resistance to the rating tactics being applied by the rider, acted more kindly leaving the elbow chute, was rated on the lead from the two path, with the top one in close attendance, felt serious pressure from that rival nearing the top of the stretch, offered good resistance before yielding, steadily weakening into the show slot. DREAM MAN rank early while displaying greenness, calmed down soon after entering the backstretch, sat reserved between rivals during most of the run around the bend, was called upon turning for home and rallied mildly to improve position. BREAK THE GLASS bumped at the break, lacked the needed response. DANNHAUSER was no factor. WIN THE DAY was bumped at the start, raced three wide, was asked for a response a the five-sixteenths pole, but failed to deliver the needed response. INDYGO PRIME bumped at the start, raced well placed along the inside for three-quarters and tired. PERFECT VELOCITY was bumped at the start, saved ground until the quarter pole, angled outward for the stretch drive, swerved out suddenly in the vicinity of the eighth pole and had little to offer thereafter. OPPOSITE strung out four wide at the three-eighths pole, tired.
