ABACO took the inside route until midway down the backstretch, well reserved under a firm hold by the pilot, tipped into the two path and bided time as her stable mate took on the front runners, was let out a notch departing the backstretch and ranged up, was guided into the three path leaving the midway point and bid from there at the five-sixteenths marker, vied with another pair until midstretch during the fastest split of the event, put them both away for good a short distance later and kicked clear, finishing under a less than vigorous hand ride. PUZZLING assumed a good position soon after the start, disputed the pace with at least two others until deep into the furlong grounds, at times from between opponents and the remainder of the time while saving ground, got overhauled by her stable mate, but continued onward willingly to secure second. ROMIN ROBIN urged three wide into the stretch, proved no match. DECENNIAL put to a snug hold by the pilot in the initial stages, appeared eager after the pokey opening fraction and was given just enough rein to burn off some of that keenness, temporarily going head to head with second place finisher about midway down the backstretch, was allowed to ease back, then re bid upon reaching the far turn, had just tucked into the two path coming to the five-sixteenths marker when the eventual winner joined the fight, fought from between the stable mates from that juncture until midstretch as the tempo quickened dramatically before backing away. WEEKEND FANTASY quickly established control, argued to maintain it being pressed by two others parked in the lanes directly outward for most of the way to the three-eighths pole, fell back steadily from that point. HARD LIFE off the inside, was asked to pick up the pace on the far turn, failed to answer the call. TRUTH WILL TELL saved ground and trailed.
