MOON RAVEN reluctant to load then quickly to the front, set all pace and held sway in the drive. ROYALLY OUTFOXED chased the winner throughout, could not get past while clearly best of the rest. TALE OF THE COURT raced evenly throughout to be clear of the rest in the stretch. WEWEWEALLDAYHOME off a bit tardy and never menaced. TOKYO broke sharp from outside and lacked a late response when needed. BE A PRINCE raced inside early, steadied while trying to get through an opening into the turn while no threat thereafter. CAT ON unhurried early, steadied into the turn when bounced around and dropped back. JOHN THE BANKER always trailed.
