POWERBALL TOO was unhurried early while five wide, rallied into the stretch and dueled on the inside, was all out to get up in the final strides. AKAPESCHE was void of early speed while four and five wide, rallied into the stretch and led late, was outfinished to the wire. SISSY BOY was in a good stalking position, rallied on the turn and took the lead, weakened late. FREEPORT BAY failed to menace. GALLOWAY PAIGE was well placed while five wide, rallied on the turn and dueled, failed to sustain the bid and dropped back. G. C. DOMINGUEZ set the pace with good early speed, faltered and faded.
