WHY STILLY WHY chased the pace early, angled into the three path in the turn then rallied in the stretch and edged past the leader in the final stages. SENOR SMILEY set the pace early, angled off the rail into the turn with a long drive in the stretch and was outfinished late. NICKEL HIDE tracked the pace early, angled into the three path in the turn then made a bid in the stretch with a long drive but hung in the late stages. BE A PRINCE bobbled at the start, angled off the rail into the turn with a late gain in the stretch drive. TEE'S PROSPECT bobbled at the start, angled into the four path in the turn then made a bid in the stretch but flattened out late in the drive. WEST LONG BRANCH chased the pace early, angled off the rail into the turn and weakened late in the stretch run. MO'S RIVERA was always outrun.
