ROMAN THREAT had speed between horses then angled in, inched away from foes nearing the half mile pole, set the pace inside, kicked clear again in the stretch and held under a brisk hand ride. CENTRALINTELLIGENCE went up between horses to press the pace then stalked off the rail, loomed behind the winner leaving the turn and into the stretch, could not catch that one but was second best. CAMP VICTORY a step slow to begin, chased outside a rival then a bit off the rail on the turn, came out in the stretch and bested the others. RAIL TRIP chased inside then outside a rival leaving the backstretch and on the turn and could not summon the necessary late kick. M ONE RIFLE had speed three deep then stalked off the rail, continued outside a rival on the turn and three wide into the stretch and weakened. SWAY AWAY bumped at the start, pulled a bit when off the rail then outside on the backstretch, went three wide on the turn and into the stretch and did not rally. DANCING IN SILKS broke out and bumped a rival, chased between horses then inside, dropped back in the stretch, gave way and was eased in the final furlong.
