Footnotes

PERPETUA sent inside to stalk the pace, continued along the rail on the turn, came out in upper stretch and again in midstretch and rallied under urging to get up in the last strides. SUDDEN SUNDAY five wide early, angled in and stalked just off the rail, bid alongside the pacesetter to gain the lead in upper stretch, inched away in midstretch, kicked clear and just failed to hold off the winner. TRIBAL CHATTER between horses early, chased three deep, angled in some leaving the turn and picked up the show. KISSIN IN THE DARK sped to the early lead off the rail, angled in and set the pace inside then a bit off the fence into the stretch, drifted in through the final furlong and weakened. SING A TALE chased between horses and was in a bit tight into the turn, continued between foes then just off the rail leaving the bend, angled to the inside into the stretchy and also weakened. AREDHHEL stalked four wide then dropped back off the rail on the turn, angled in a bit and had little left for the stretch. EMERALD ISLAND dropped back off the rail early, angled in leaving the backstretch, saved ground on the turn and lacked a further response.
