CAVALLETTA sped to the lead on the inside into the first turn, set the pace a bit off the rail, was challenged for command in midstretch, drifted out through the final furlong and held for the narrow decision. LADY SHAZZAM pulled a bit into the first turn, stalked on the outside down the backstretch and around the second turn, came into the lane four wide, rallied between horses late but could not get by the winner. MENDING WALL was between horses into the first turn, stalked on the inside down the backstretch, saved ground around the second turn, challenged for the lead in midstretch, drifted out in the final furlong but was a clear third at the wire. CENTERVILLE was three wide into the first turn, stalked on the outside down the backstretch, came into the lane three wide, weakened in the lane and was not persevered with in the final sixteenth. WILD TO WIN was between horses on the first turn, chased off the rail then angled in into the second turn, remained inside the rest of the journey and gave way. NOELLI saved ground around the first turn, chased on the inside then angled out into the second turn, was eased the length of the stretch and bled.
