Footnotes

MODERATION was well placed in the early going while just off the leaders, moved closer into the second turn, circled three wide to the stretch and took command at the furlong pole then continued to respond and held IRISH LINEN safe in the closing stages. IRISH LINEN trailed early, advanced gradually to the second turn, followed MODERATION into the lane, loomed boldly in the deep stretch but could make no impact. KING'S CHARMER stalked the pace from the outset, moved up to challenge SUNETTE from the outside on the second turn, led into the stretch but slackened in the final furlong. BETTY'S GRACE raced unhurried early from the rail, raced two wide on the second turn but failed to muster a closing rally. DOMINION RHYTHM settled early from the rail, came to the outside for the second turn but failed to reach contention. SUNETTE dueled outside LADY WOODMAN early, took command after a half mile, dropped to the rail for the second turn but had little left. LADY WOODMAN alternated on the early lead from the rail but faded steadily after the opening half.
