Footnotes

MISS BLUE BAYOU had the best speed and set all the pace to the stretch, responded when roused for the drive and held. MISS ALLIE GATOR tracked the pace to the turn, saved ground to the stretch, could not impact the winner, lost second briefly in deep stretch but had a late surge to gain the place. WOODFORD PRINCESS pressed the pace to the turn but was caught four wide, continued on when set down for the drive, could not catch the winner but got a nose in front late for second then was outfinished. BETTOR MET had no speed, saved ground to the stretch and closed mildly late. PILGRIM MISS tracked the pace to the turn, was asked for more into the stretch but finished evenly. VICTOR'S BELLE was fractious in the gate and bobbed slightly at the start, recovered and pressured the pace while three wide to the stretch then weakened in the final furlong. SUCCESS IN EXCESS threw her head at the start, was hard to settle or place early, steered to the outside of horses, raced five wide to the stretch and had nothing to offer in the drive.
