Footnotes

TONSILITIS never far back to the turn, saved ground to the stretch, found an opening between rivals in upper stretch, responded quickly and split horses, took over nearing the sixteenth pole and drove clear. CLASS EDITION took back inside and shifted outside rivals early on the backstretch, commenced a bid on the turn, had to circle four wide to the stretch then made a late charge but was outfinished. BEEZER never far back to the turn, bid three wide to the stretch, tried to rally but was going evenly then was brushed by SILVER BOX, separated then came in and brushed that rival again late, bounced out and had to take up off heels at the wire. SILVER BOX attended the pace outside of FASHIONABLY LITE to the stretch, responded to mid stretch, was tiring and drifted out brushing with BEEZER then was brushed again by that one late. FASHIONABLY LITE hustled to the front soon after the start, set a pressured pace to the stretch but tired leaving the furlong grounds.
