HEZA WILD GUY was held up outside foes racing four wide into the first turn, continued in reserve for a half, advanced four deep nearing the far turn to challenge, took over nearing midstretch and pulled clear under steady prompting. BIG TEX, off a step slowly, was settled for a half, came around foes three or four wide on the far turn and continued well to secure second in the final stages. SILVER PEAGUS went readily to the fore, attended the pace outside a rival racing to the far turn, edged forward of that foe on the second bend but couldn't sustain his momentum. OUT DAR broke sharply, disputed the pace along the rail racing to the far turn, then gave way entering upper stretch. CHASKA tracked the pace between foes in second flight but couldn't produce the needed closing bid. DEPUTY TICE tracked the leaders along the inside racing to the far turn but lacked the necessary late response. THUNDEROUS SUMMER raced three deep as part of the second flight for a half, then emptied out nearing the far turn.
