AL'S DEARLY BRED, unhurried in early stages tracking the pace outside a few rivals, made steady progress three wide into the far turn to gain striking distance, switched out in upper stretch to collar JEB'S HONOR with a quick move and went clear in the final stages under brisk encouragement. The latter was brushed in the early stages while being floated out by KING'S VERSE, stalked just off the pacesetter under rating to the far turn, challenged readily racing into the lane, proved no match when confronted by the winner but held gamely for second. KING'S VERSE raced with the pace while drifting out and brushing a rival racing to the first bend, was allowed to settle along the inside racing through the backstretch, continued in that path to upper stretch while making a rival challenge but came up empty late. THATSUSINTHEOLBEAN, unhurried saving ground in the opening half, made an effort to improve his position in the latter stages. CHAMPS PUMA, allowed to settle just out of striking distance, made a brief bid three wide racing into the far turn but soon flattened out. NOW PLAYING went clear, made the pace to the far turn and emptied out in the drive. TCS EXPRESS PRINCE was never a serious factor. BOBBY NAZ was a brief factor along the inside but fell back early.
