OFFSHORE NEWS broke sharply, attended the early pace in hand racing three or four deep, angled inwards to press a rival racing into the bend, took over nearing upper stretch and held sway through the lane under steady encouragement. QUAKER CHANGE, unhurried tracking the leaders five deep on the backstretch, made steady progress outside foes to gain striking distance leaving the turn but proved no match for the winner in the drive while clearly best of the remaining field. HOLY TO US was a bit outpaced in early stages, shifted off the inside to split foes in a belated effort but had no real impact. SERENA'S RUN tracked the leaders six wide on the backstretch and never gained contention. CHAKALAKA BABY raced with the pace along the inside to the turn, then faded steadily from contention after a half. MISS STIPENDS never seriously menaced. CARSON'S RUMOR was hustled to the front, dueled for command along the rail, couldn't match the winner after a half and gave way in upper stretch. SCRUB CAT flashed brief pace between foes but was finished after the opening quarter. BUCKY BELLE broke a bit awkwardly and trailed the field throughout.
