Footnotes

TECHNICAL EXPRESS was held up saving ground racing just out of striking distance in the opening stages, made a steady advance racing nearest the rail on the far turn to gain contention, angled outside the leader in upper stretch and took over from that foe in the final sixteenth under firm encouragement. WAR ENSIGN broke sharply, went clear of the field into the backstretch, held sway to upper stretch but proved no match when confronted by the winner. MATT N MITCH raced unhurried tracking the pace in early stages, saved ground to upper stretch and secured a share in the drive. COUNTRY ZIP, forwardly placed between foes racing to the backstretch, steadily faded from contention on the far turn. POWERFUL PEPPER was allowed to settle in the opening half and never gained striking distance. DIRT FARMER, caught five wide racing into the first turn, soon dropped out. MARIA'S SIREN joined the pace four wide racing into the first turn but was finished after a half. EL INTOCHABLE prompted the pace between foes into the first turn, gave way after a half, was soon outdistanced, then walked off the course under his own power.
