Footnotes

LOOK TO THE DAY was settled between foes along the inside racing into the first turn, angled to the rail on the backstretch while making a steady advance, came inside BAYFIELD BLUES in upper stretch to challenge and edged CHILIPIN under firm handling. The latter stalked the pacesetter in hand through the opening half, steadily closed the gap on that foe leaving the far turn, struck the front in mid stretch but came up second best. ONE MILE LIMIT, reserved well off the pace to the backstretch, rallied six wide racing into the lane and continued with a belated gain. BAYFIELD BLUES was hustled clear soon after the break, angled inside on the first turn, made the pace to upper stretch but weakened once headed. SUMINISTER, allowed to settle in the opening stages, came off the inside on the backstretch and continued to improve position. FUJIYAMA MAMA was settled racing to the backstretch and made an effort to pass some tiring rivals in the latter stages. ISBELL AMBIEL raced unhurried in the opening half and never gained striking position. BLUSHING JABAR was caught wide racing to the backstretch and dropped out of contention entering the far turn. LOST LISA was rated between foes but was finished after a half. RARE RUM stalked the pacesetter between foes to the backstretch but dropped out after six furlongs. HOME FOR CHRISTMAS chased the pacesetter for a half and gave way. COUNTRY GIRL DRINK was angled to the rail to track the pace and soon gave way.
