Footnotes

VICTORY SLED mid pack and inside, moved to position through the turn, drifted out while gaining in the lane and drove clear late. SAMENDRA mid pack and outside, looped rivals three wide through the turn, bid widest into the stretch, then made a steady gain to get up for the place while no threat to the winner. DESERT ALLEY sent from the gate to set the early pace inside, shook clear into the turn, increased his margin, then weakened in the late going. MONDOVI bobbed at the start, moved up on the two path through the turn, angled out into the stretch to bid four wide, then lacked the needed late kick. BLACK TIE BENNY tracked the pace off the rail and faded after a half. GOOD GUY LARRY showed little. VIC THE KICK vied for the early lead outside and stopped.
