Footnotes

LATECIA'S LAST shifted in sharply when in tight at the start, was allowed to settle along the rail, saved ground through the turn while steadily improving her position, slipped inside rivals entering the lane and continued her rally in late stages to edge clear under steady urging. REBAS RECKONING exchanged bumps with SMART ALEK on the backstretch, recovered to bid four wide leaving the turn, but came up second best. ROSES AND DIAMONDS swerved in AT THE BREAK break, was righted to force the pace three wide into the turn, had brief command in upper stretch, but weakened late. EXCLUSIVE EVE broke inwards at the start, was allowed to settle on the rail and passed tiring rivals late. MS FANCY PANTS, a bit outpaced early, never threatened. ICE ME was under pressure to contend between foes, gave way approaching the quarter pole. SMART ALEK exchanged brushes with a rival early, was caught five wide racing to the turn, lost ground and was not abused in the final quarter. TULIP CREEK was hustled up the rail to set the pace, dueled into the turn and gave way after a half.
