Weight 122 lbs.

Non-winners of \$50,000 allowed 3 lbs.; three races other than maiden or claiming, 5 lbs.; two races other than maiden or claiming, 8 lbs.; a race other than maiden or claiming, 10 lbs.

Footnotes

PATIENCE GAME in traffic near the end of the chute, was angled out for clear room, made a four wide run on the turn, took over when ready in upper stretch and stayed clear under steady urging. PRIME DIRECTIVE, bumped at the start, was outrun early, advanced four wide on the turn and rallied willingly in the middle of the strip to be second best while not a real threat to the winner. STRAIGHT MAN set the pace while kept off the inside, stayed well to midstretch and tired late. YES IT'S TRUE bobbled slightly after the start, made a quick recovery and pressed the pace while three wide, continued pressing to the stretch and tired in the drive. LEAD EM HOME, bumped at the start, recovered, prompted the pace, inside rivals, raced along the rail on the turn and gave way in the stretch. KUTSA, outrun early off the inside, was angled out in upper stretch but was no menace. DONERAILE COURT, within striking distance, saved ground on the turn and faded in the drive. HECTOR, within striking distance inside, faded. NEBRASSKA, within striking distance off the inside, faded.
