

FLUTE worked her way inward early, settled between foes near the inside, came out approaching the stretch commencing a sweeping run six or seven wide, wrested command in the upper stretch, then maintained her advantage under energetic hand urging. REAL COZZY bobbled soon after the start, angled in soon after to race three wide into the backstretch, made a bold run five wide between horses approaching the stretch, angled out a bit farther on the track for the drive, finished with good courage but couldn't menace FLUTE in the late stages. COLLECT CALL, forwardly placed in behind rivals early, also moved between horses nearing the final quarter, loomed a solid threat but gained only slightly at the end. FLEET RENEE, seven or eight wide into the backstretch, angled in between foes, edged closer on the second turn, came out seven or eight abreast when straightened for the drive as the field bunched, then couldn't seriously threaten while improving position. TAP DANCE went up early to contest the pace five wide, held on well until the final quarter and weakened gradually. LATOUR edged in early while gaining a forward position, loomed prominently through the upper stretch six wide but flattened out. MYSTIC LADY maneuvered inside early to vie for the lead, battled with TAP DANCE and NASTY STORM, held on well until the upper stretch and weakened. MORNING SUN saved ground around the second turn, came out six or seven wide while rallying, was in tight quarters at the eighth pole and lacked a further account. MYSIA JO angled inside soon after the start, was outrun until the stretch, circled foes 10 or 12 wide and failed to reach serious contention while improving position. PLATINUM TIARA, seven or eight wide much of the way, failed to menace. QUICK TIP raced in behind rivals four wide and wasn't a factor. DANCETHRUTHEDAWN, steadied briefly along the inside nearing the first turn, saved ground the remainder but tired. NASTY STORM went up early to contest the pace while between rivals, put a head in front briefly on the second turn but gave way readily soon after.
