Footnotes

SHOT OF KELA bobbled at the start, was outrun for three furlongs, moved out five wide late on the turn when rallying and finished well to be up in the final stride. BILLY'S BAND vied for the lead three wide and held on tenaciously to miss. BID'S REWARD broke in the air, recovered to race within striking distance, challenged from the four path on the turn and held on gamely to the finish. TORO GRANDE within striking distance off the rail, angled to the inside in midstretch but hung. PRIME SPEED within reach along the inside, steadied in upper stretch, angled out in midstretch but lacked a closing bid. DELAGO contested the pace along the inside and gave way. MISSISSIPPI MONEY alternated for the lead between rivals and tired. MAJOR ADVANTAGE prompted the early pace three wide and faded.
