WAYWARD SAILOR closest to the pace off the inside, responded to pressure in the stretch and was up in the final stride. DOGWOODS BARTO sprinted clear and angled in, set the pace along the inside and just failed. DANGER STORM close up while off the rail, raced in the three path on the second turn and tired in the drive. E WALD within striking distance three wide, moved in a path on the second turn and tired in the stretch. SLINGER lost his footing after the start, was a bit eager when close up along the inside, held on well to the final quarter and tired.
