Footnotes

SAN DARE, outrun for six furlongs while in behind horses, circled the field nine or 10 wide for the drive and was hard ridden to edge clear late. SWEETMILK CREEK, unhurried early, settled in behind rivals on the backstretch, swung out five wide for the drive, loomed menacingly for the last eighth, drifted in when appearing clear of rivals while gaining almost even terms for the lead inside the winner, then couldn't match strides late. DIXIE SCHIC, unhurried early and three wide for six furlongs, came out seven or eight abreast for the drive and offered a minor late gain. BAG OF STARS moved up early to gain a slim lead while dueling outside of TAP THE SKY, managed a narrow advantage into the final furlong, drifted out and weakened. ROXAEDIT, well placed inside for three-quarters, eased out five wide for the drive, was forced out at the eighth pole by BAG OF STARS when that one drifted out, was checked, then flattened out. RENAISSANCE FAIR, within easy striking distance while following the leaders four or five wide, flattened out in the drive. WHITE CHOCOLATE, outrun four wide until the final quarter, came out five wide for the drive but couldn't muster a closing account. TAP THE SKY moved up near the inside to duel for the lead early, battled with BAG OF STARS while inside that one until the final furlong and weakened. TRUE WOOMAN, a bit rank early, forced the pace four wide, continued forwardly until the final quarter and tired. The stewards posted the inquiry sign involving the stretch runs of BAG OF STARS and SWEETMILK CREEK. Following a review of the video tape replays, insufficient evidence was found for action.
