Footnotes

CAJUN MON, bumped at the start by ALBERT THE GOLD, raced four or five wide while outrun, advanced seven wide into the stretch and was hard ridden to prevail. CLIFTON MARKET, never far back and four or five wide, moved with the winner while inside that one leaving the furlong grounds, gained even terms for the lead but wasn't good enough. NEED MONEY DAD drifted in at the start, continued inward to force the pace three abreast, took over, was clear for the last eighth but could not last. LAUGH A DAY, steadied at the start, raced six wide into the stretch and improved position while not a threat. JIMTOWN, in tight inside at the half-mile ground, quickly recovered, battled forwardly to the stretch and tired. THEYCALLMECOWBOY, sluggish to begin and squeezed back, failed to menace when passing tired foes. WAIT NO LONGER came out at the start, went up soon after to attend the pace between rivals, continued forwardly to the stretch and weakened. LAST DREAM, steadied between horses at the half-mile ground, weakened concluding the turn. GOTTA BEAU, unruly behind the gate prior to being loaded, raced forwardly five wide for three furlongs and weakened. ALBERT THE GOLD drifted in at the start bumping CAJUN MON, then was outrun. LUHUKATMEGO, checked sharply in tight quarters between foes at the half-mile ground, dropped back thereafter.
