FLASHY LASSIE outrun early, made a run four wide late on the turn and closed fast to be up in time. FIVE STAR MOMMA behind the leaders while unhurried, moved up three wide on the turn, took over once in the stretch, led the field into the final sixteenth and was clearly second best while no match for the winner late. QUEEN TEUTA hit the side of the starting gate stall at the start and came away slowly, was outrun off the inside, angled out for the drive and improved her position while no threat. MY DUE PROCESS sluggish at the start, quickly gained a striking position, held on well to the stretch and tired. TIPPY TOES reserved along the inside, could no threaten. CULOTTE sprinted clear and angled to the inside, vied for the lead along the rail, held on well to the stretch and tired. SHOCKTIME forced the pace off the inside, held on well to the stretch and gave way.
