PURE GLITTER gained a clear lead early, moved in three wide, went along under careful handling, then was fully extended to last. FLYING MARLIN, unhurried early and four wide, came out and split the leaders five wide at the furlong grounds and was getting to PURE GLITTER in the late stages. LA TORAH DE TARA, reserved early and angled in to race four wide, continued inside into the stretch, made a bold run leaving the furlong grounds and failed to sustain the needed momentum. TAP THE SKY, well placed four or five wide to the stretch, came out six abreast and was empty late. JEANIE SUE, unhurried early, made a run along the rail approaching the stretch, eased out three wide for the drive but flattened out soon after. CHANGE THE PLAY, close up between rivals three wide, was asked for her best a quarter-mile out and faltered when straightened for the drive. TRUE WOOMAN, well placed early while following the winner five wide, was put to a drive entering the far turn, continued forwardly until nearing the stretch and tired.
