LONE STAR SKY, well placed from early on while between foes three or four wide, eased out five wide to rally entering the stretch, was soundly shaken up with the whip left handed, then, after the rider switched the stick to his right hand, won going away. POSSE, never far back while tracking the pace four wide, moved to the fore nearing the final quarter, then wasn't a match for the winner late. COOPER CROSSING, six or seven wide during the opening furlong, edged near the inside concluding the backstretch, moved with the winner while inside that one approaching the final quarter, found an opening in the final furlong three or four wide but couldn't muster the needed response. WHITE CAT, lightly bumped at the break, settled inside, moved three wide on the turn and into the stretch, angle to the rail for the last eighth but failed to offer a closing account. BOSTON PARK, close up between foes early, pressed front-running WILD BID, stuck his head in front between calls on the turn, lost the advantage to POSSE a quarter-mile out and weakened thereafter. AIR LORDAN, within striking distance to the stretch although five or six wide, came up empty. WILD BID drifted in at the start bumping lightly with WHITE CAT, was sent to the fore soon after inside, lost the advantage between calls on the turn to BOSTON PARK, gave way, then wasn't persevered with late.
