PROVEN QUALITY pressed the pace along the inside, poked his head in front with five-sixteenths to run, shook clear entering the stretch and held sway. SAUL TO PAUL stalked the pace on the outside, made his bid entering the stretch, was unable to reach the winner and was all out to earn the place. CAJUN PRIZE contended between horses, continued on willingly through a long drive and was gaining steadily late. D. C. NINER attended the pace under a snug hold along the inside, dropped off of the pace through the second turn, angled out and came again five wide, loomed large with a furlong to run but failed to sustain the drive. Z GREY dropped far back early, came four wide to make a belated gain but was never a factor. SAINT LEON set the pressured pace two wide, was headed after six furlongs and gave way readily thereafter. HOMETOWN KID was always outrun.
