LIGHT UP THE SCORE tracked the pace in hand, made a sweeping move through the turn, assumed command, shook clear and held safely. DEPECHE CHAT settled saving ground, shifted out leaving the turn, split horses and finished willingly to prove second best. DEVIL TRAIN prompted the pace along the inside, was unable to match strides with the top two but had enough left to hold the show. TEMP broke slow, tucked in to save ground, got through to make his bid but failed to sustain the drive. BIG ALBERT contended between horses, but lacked a response when called upon. SATURDAY DANCE was unhurried into stride, came five wide and finished with a belated gain. LITTLE SHEIK set the pressured pace off of the inside to the stretch and dropped out. BEAMER broke slow, was rank to place and was never a factor. SCULPTOR was through early.
