BEAR ISLAND dueled on the pace from outside ILE ST. FRANCES throughout, continued well in the lane and edged clear late. ILE ST. FRANCES dueled from inside the winner throughout, continued well through the lane but could not match strides late. JOKIN N SMOKIN was five wide in the first turn, moved up three wide in the far turn, bumped with a foe turning for home and continued to improve position while no threat to the top pair. ADMIRAL PAUL angled out through the first turn to follow the pace four and five wide then lacked a final closing run. LIL BUDDY saved ground throughout, bumped with a rival turning for home and lacked a rally. MISTER SUH moved up with a mild four wide bid heading up the backstretch and weakened. LAZER RED showed speed from between rivals to late backstretch and tired. MINOR LEAGER was always outrun.
