Footnotes

ARCH THIRTEEN was unhurried while racing in the two paths around the first turn, moved up on the far outside down the backstretch, raced five deep around the far turn, reached even terms with BUSTER DOUGLAS nearing the eighth pole, dueled outside of that rival to deep stretch and prevailed. BUSTER DOUGLAS pressed the pace just outside of PAUL'S FINAL ONE around the first turn, bid between rivals nearing the half-mile pole, took the lead entering the far turn, vied two wide around that bend, inched clear turning for the home, dug in when challenged by the winner nearing the eighth pole but was outfinished late. I'M A WAHOO stalked the leaders three wide around the first turn, bid between rivals down the backstretch, raced four wide between horses around the far turn, vied inside the top two in upper stretch then gave way approaching the eighth pole. AFFIRMED ON APPEAL was devoid of speed, passed tiring rivals in the stretch. KINTLA'S FOLLY stalked the leaders from the rail, bid three wide while racing between rivals down the backstretch, vied to the quarter pole then tired. PAUL'S FINAL ONE set the pace along the rail, faltered around the far turn.
