Footnotes

WHAT A WILDCAT tracked the pace three wide, moved to even terms into the far turn, quickly kicked clear leaving the three eighths pole, dropped to the inside, responded to strong handling in the lane and prevailed. TALK settled off the rail, made a solid four wide run mid way on the final turn, sustained his run and was steadily getting to the winner. WHISKEY KEG , three wide within range, steadied when in close around the far turn, regrouped, circled four wide into the stretch and closed willingly. HOWZABOUTCHA broke a step slow, was unhurried early while saving ground, angled out leaving the far turn, circled five wide into the stretch and had a mild late response. CROWN COURT , between rivals leaving the far turn, progressed into the stretch, angled in and continued on with some interest. CONGRATS DUKE was steadied inside nearing the first turn, angled out nearing the half mile marker, advanced between rivals around the final turn then flattened out late. JACK SAW , taken to rate inside, steadied along lacking room around the far turn, made a mild run into the lane then came up empty through the final eighth. MONGOOSE DANCER was steadied back after being rushed up along the rail under the wire the first time, rated off the leaders leaving the five eighths pole, angled out and moved closer into the far turn, chased the leader to the quarter pole then gave way. SUN AGAIN lacked room around the far turn. TRIPPINGLY broke slowly, lagged far back and passed tired rivals. ROBBY'S BREAK set a

pressured early pace inside and faltered. SIR WINSTON G. vied two wide to the far turn and faltered.
