GLORIOUS SUNRISE chased the pace between rivals, eased out and lodged a three wide bid leaving the eighth pole, gained a short lead inside the sixteenth pole, dueled and narrowly prevailed under a drive. GEAUX BAYOU saved ground chasing the pace, lodged a rail bid leaving mid stretch, drew on even terms a sixteenth out, dueled inside the winner and just missed in a sharp effort. FLYBYBOY lagged early, raced three wide into the lane then finished strongly between rivals. CATTING, four to five wide, made a mild run near the sixteenth pole then hung. AFTERNOON JAZZ was steadied briefly entering the turn, angled out four wide mid turn, closed ground six wide leaving the sixteenth marker then hung. GET READY AND DRAW had speed to clear, set the pace two wide into the lane, held well to the sixteenth pole then weakened. OUR CHIEF JUSTICE prompted the pace three wide, raced four wide in upper stretch then gave way.
