Footnotes

VIOLETTE BONBON angled off the inside near the six furlong marker, prompted the pace, edged closer approaching the lane, took over three wide nearing the eighth pole, kicked well clear a sixteenth out then held sway under a drive. I'VEGOTADATE lacked speed, came under pressure while three to four wide leaving the far turn, continued outside and finished up well through the final seventy yards. SUMMER GIRL saved ground under early rating, edged closer the far turn, angled, made a run between rivals near the quarter pole then lacked the needed finish. MOMS R SPECIAL was rated back soon after the break, advanced along the rail near the half mile marker, chased and came up empty late. COYOTE'S DREAM drew clear the first turn, set the pace towards the inside, was collared in upper stretch and weakened through the final sixteenth. BABY MIAH, three wide, made a mild run near the five sixteenths pole then weakened. LIESEL dropped back between rivals.
