SILVER MAX assumed the early lead, was well off the rail on the first turn, rated kindly inside TWO MONTHS RENT when that one rushed up on the backstretch to gain the lead, regained command on the far turn, responded to urging entering the stretch, was put to the whip in upper stretch and readily held sway while kept to his business. LUCKY CHAPPY (IRE) lacked speed while two wide on the first turn, rated patiently, was three wide leaving the far turn, remained outside horses and closed gamely late. FINNEGANS WAKE lacked speed, was steadied on the heels of a rival along the rail entering the first turn, saved ground to the far turn, eased out to the three path mid way on the final bend, ranged up outside the winner in upper stretch then flattened out. OPTIMIZER lacked speed, saved ground under patient handling, entered the stretch along the rail, steadied on the heels of EASY CROSSING when swung to the four path in upper stretch then rallied nicely. COACH ROYAL saved ground stalking the pace, eased out to the two path on the far turn, remained prominent to upper stretch then weakened. MR. HANDSOME, three wide the first turn while well back, hugged the rail through the stretch and failed to menace. EASY CROSSING, forwardly placed early, was in the two path on the far turn and gave way in upper stretch. TWO MONTHS RENT had his saddle slip entering the first turn, rushed up well wide down the backstretch, remained out of harm's way and was pulled up.
