Footnotes

GRAD STUDENT settled off the pace inside BETHEL at the rear, advanced on the far turn while shifting off the rail, was three to four wide at the top of the lane, drove to the lead in mid-stretch and drew clear under steady handling. BETHEL raced outside the winner for half, advanced just after that one while staying in the two path on the far turn, angled out to the four path in upper stretch, could not match the winner but was clear to be second best. SINGMETOTHEMOON prompted the pace from outside, collared the pacesetter late on the backstretch but upon assuming command faced a challenger on his outside, dueled with that one to mid-stretch, dispatched him but was no match for the top two who drove past. BASHFUL BANDIT stalked the early pace three wide, edged closer to force the issue heading into the far turn, bid for the lead leaving the turn, could not sustain the effort and flattened out in deep stretch. BIG SHINDIG set the pace, faltered late on the backstretch and faded thereafter. CHILEAN BOY angled to the four path early on the first turn, was in pursuit of the early pace from that vantage point, dropped back, tired.
