### Footnotes

DAWN'S SONG stalked the pace along the inside, altered course outside the leaders in midstretch, then rallied to be up in time. SPRING BEAUTY rank when taken in hand to stalk the pace three wide, rallied to gain the lead at the eighth pole but couldn't resist the winner in the closing strides. ROBIN'S COMMANDER unhurried early, swung out for the stretch run, bumped with SACRED DESIRE at the sixteenth and closed to edge that rival for the show. SACRED DESIRE reserved while saving ground, angled out in the stretch, then steadied when she bumped with ROBIN'S COMMANDER at the sixteenth pole and just missed the show. PARIS WEEKEND rated off the pace, raced four wide around the far turn and had no response in the drive. SERENE LIGHT chased the pace, made a run with SPRING BEAUTY to reach even terms for command at the eighth pole, then tired. MAMBO MAYA raced in striking position to nearing the stretch, then faltered. PHI SLAMMA JAMMA set the pace along the rail into the stretch, then gave way. MARILLA was not a factor.
