Footnotes

THE BEST GLACIER well placed racing along the rail, rallied to gain a slim lead inside the eighth pole, then was all out to prevail. COMMANDER TATE pressed the pace outside I CAN AND I WILL, took over from that rival at the top of the stretch, then responded when THE BEST GLACIER moved to gain the lead just inside the eighth pole and continued on gamely while being edged to the wire. I CAN AND I WILL set the pace along the inside, came out a bit for the stretch run and gave way. OLYMPIC TOUR rated off the pace, advanced four wide down the backstretch to reach the leaders but couldn't stay with the top ones around the far turn and tired. UNO AGAIN unhurried early, advanced with the field down the backstretch to reach contention, raced four wide around the far turn and faltered. ADRIATIC steadied along the inside racing into the first turn, was reserved in striking position to the top of the stretch, then faded. BATTLE MUSIC stalked the pace three wide, made a run to join the leaders racing into the far turn, then had nothing left.
