BOLD PETE well placed in behind the leaders, made a run four wide on the far turn to reach near even terms for command, then responded to pressure and wore down SILVER CHALLENGE to be just up at the wire. The latter, reserved racing along the rail, slipped through inside BAG THAT ALARM to gain a slim lead at the top of the stretch, then just failed to last after a prolonged duel. DUDEMAN unhurried early, angled outside the leaders in the stretch and closed to gain the show while no match for the top ones. LITTLE VILLAIN outrun early, swung wide for the stretch run and passed tired rivals without threatening. TOCA ARAKEN prompted the pace three wide to the top of the stretch and tired. SWORD CHIEF failed to menace. BAG THAT ALARM quickly moved to the fore, made the pace off the rail to the top of the stretch and faltered.
