GIBSON COUNTY LINE tracked the pace three wide, rallied to take over at the eighth pole, then drew away. SAINT PETE chased the pace off the rail around the turn, then couldn't stay with the winner while up for the place. PRINCE LIAM reserved off the pace, saved ground and closed to up for the show while unable to keep pace with the top one. ETZEME rated off the pace, raced three wide around the and just missed the show while unable to match strides with the winner. REX'S LAST TOUR outrun early, swung out for the stretch run and never threatened. SKIBO IN JULY chased the pace off the rail, moved to take over leaving the turn, made the pace to nearing the eighth pole, then tired. SEVEN KIND showed speed along the inside to past the quarter pole, then was fading when steadied along the rail in the stretch. ISLAND SCHOLAR was no factor while racing four wide.
