TOO MUCH BLING steadied in behind LORD VICAR in the early going, advanced three wide to reach the leaders midway of the turn, vied with MACH RIDE to the eighth pole, then edged away when asked. MACH RIDE vied for the lead along the inside with LAPTOP COMPUTER, responded when challenged by TOO MUCH BLING on the turn but couldn't stay with that rival late while clearly second best. BLAZING RATE outrun after being caught in tight at the start, closed with a mild response to gain the show. LAPTOP COMPUTER vied for the lead outside MACH RIDE to nearing the stretch, then tired. NORTHERN SOLDIER showed early foot, raced three wide on the turn and faltered. YES HE'S THE MAN well placed in behind the leaders, was steadied from tight quarters racing down the backstretch, remained in contention to nearing the stretch, then faded. FOLK FESTIVAL (GB) was not a factor. LORD VICAR was done early and eased in the final eighth.
