Footnotes

THREE PART HARMONY broke on top, used a bit early to narrowly show the way through the first turn off the inside, got clear before a half while slowing the pace down slightly, increased that advantage late in the final turn, not threatened in the drive, won ridden out. YA YA'S RULES last away, lacked speed for six furlongs, came on the outside and three wide into the lane, mild rally to annex the place, no match for the winner. GIMMEAWINKPOPPY stalked the pace off the inside, called on for some run turning for home, failed to do much with the winner, could not contain the runner up late, clear of the rest. BISHOP OF NOLA outrun off the inside, raced between rivals into the lane, lacked a serious late kick. EDGE AHEAD saved ground well off the pace, was never dangerous. SOLE RUNNER pressured the winner early from along the inside, closest to that foe in the run up the backstretch, retreated through the stretch.
