CLOSE IT OUT pressured the pace two deep, assumed control three wide entering the stretch, was urged clear toward the eighth pole and kept alert to widen. DEAL IN THE LOT chased the pace four wide, lost some ground leaving the quarter pole and finished well to be second best. BULL DOZER chased the pace inside, had aim at the rail in the upper stretch and remained a close factor to the eighth pole before leveling off. GAMBARU showed no speed inside, angled to the outside in the upper stretch and finished evenly. D' DREAM quickly established control to set a pressured pace inside, came out a path leaving the five sixteenths pole, dueled between horses in the upper stretch but leveled off inside the eighth pole. CITY GENIUS chased the pace inside, drifted outward in the upper stretch and weakened. BARRY K chased the pace two deep through the backstretch, faded on the turn then weakened in the stretch.
