Footnotes

PIGEON CHRIS rated a clear lead inside, widened leaving the five sixteenths pole and finished much the best with minimal encouragement. COVERT AFFAIR settled back toward the inside, bid leaving the three eighths pole, proved no match for the winner and settled for second best. STOP THE BULL, off the early pace inside, eased to the three path leaving the first turn, gave chase from the three eighths, rounded the final turn three wide then leveled off down the lane. DANIEL'S BOY rated close to the early pace off the rail, gave chase through the backstretch but showed little further response rounding the final turn. FOUR PROSPECTS, off the early pace toward mid track, saved some ground on the final turn and proved empty down the lane. NO MORE CAPERS saved ground well back. LAST SESSION, five wide the first turn, showed no response racing outside. CORNELL GRAD, four wide the first turn, saved ground through the final turn. BOOGUCHI BOY was through early and eased.
