Footnotes

COAL FIRED, off the pace inside, bid at the five sixteenths pole, eased out to come between horses at the head of the lane and dug in under determined handling to take over and inch ahead the final yards. SUMMER HUSTLER, four wide the opening turn, raced evenly to the three eighths pole, bid toward the five sixteenths, dueled for control four wide nearing the top of the stretch, eased to the two path past the eighth pole and held the advantage to deep stretch before reluctantly ceding. GREEN SPRING BOY settled back inside, bid toward the quarter pole, eased five wide into the lane and was along late for show. PETER G kept close to the pace off the rail, gave chase toward the three eighths pole, dueled to a slim brief lead between horses midway on the final turn, was shuffled back into the stretch and leveled off from there. CHIEF MCGEE kept close to the early pace about the three path, gave chase at the five sixteenths pole but leveled off rounding the final turn. I'M ALL SPOTTED UP rated the early pace inside, was pressured from the seven sixteenths pole, caught midway on the final turn and lacked further down the lane. GREEN GIBBON saved ground.
