Footnotes

FIRSTIE settled well back of the early pace toward mid track, started a bid at the half mile pole, steadily advanced to take over two deep mid turn, was soon clear and under steady handling through the stretch. SIGNATURE RUN rated back two deep, bid toward the five sixteenths pole, eased five wide in mid turn, dueled for place in late yards and finished well. CAPTAIN TEN rated close about the three path, bid leaving the three eighths pole then leveled off in the stretch. THUNDERELLO DANCER moved clear to rate the pace inside, was caught past the quarter pole then leveled off in the stretch. BEE REGAL was no factor toward the outside. BROOKS IN TOWN, well back inside, started a mild bid past the half mile pole, bobbled approaching the five sixteenths pole, was checked past the pole and not a further factor. GENERAL LAD stalked the pace off the rail, gave chase from the seven sixteenths pole but faded on the final turn. STRIKETHREEYOUROUT saved ground and was through early. BLAME IT ON BUSH was kept close to the early pace about the three path then faded through the backstretch. BUDDINSKI was not a factor.
